CLEANLINESS DRIVE

During our field visits to Mayabazar and Anandapuram localities we have observed garbage dumping in many places. So, with the support from BBMP (local municipality) we have started a cleanliness drive in these localities. In Mayabazar we requested BBMP health inspector Mr. Chidanand to get the areas cleaned and the sanitation workers supported the SOCHARA team by cleaning these areas. Later with the help of volunteers from the community we put bleaching powder (disinfectant/germicide) in the cleaned areas. In Anandapuram Mr. Venkat, the health inspector too supported us in the activity and we followed the same process. Our field coordinators supervised the activity in both Mayabazar and Anandapuram.

In the coming months we plan to involve the community members to keep their surroundings clean. We will be planning activities to inform the community members about the importance of keeping their surroundings clean and the ill-effects of unclean surroundings on health.

CHENNAI UPDATE

HCL- F supported SOCHARA WASH project, Chennai team initiated field visits to 12 project schools and 7 boys and girls police clubs.

The purpose of these visits was to locate the listed project areas and introduce the team to the respective in-charges. The team also discussed with the police club members and the school authorities about WASH related infrastructure requirements for students and planned for awareness programmes in these field areas.

In this course of action, the team has identified that each police club has a scout master and teachers, managed by the inspector of the police station located in the particular area. These clubs provide a learning space outside school for students and offers facilities like private tuitions conducted by the teachers of the club and also engage students in sports activities which they otherwise cannot afford.

We met and interacted with the scout master in the boys & girls police clubs and the Headmaster/Headmistress in the schools and received good response from them. The school principal introduced the teachers in-charge to plan for awareness programmes once the schools re-open. Scout masters have also committed to support in the activities discussed with them. Both the scout masters and school authorities have agreed to share the infrastructure/repair work details needed in their premises.

Following the discussion, along with the scout masters, in each police club, we have identified a location for toilet building. Also, in the schools, we have identified the areas in need of WASH related repair works along with the school authorities. During this conversation, we also interacted and with the other HCL-F partners in the respective project areas.

As a way forward, detailed situational analysis will be performed. Subsequently, identification of resource persons followed by WASH related infrastructure building and repair works will be planned and processed in the project areas.
