Awareness sessions for women were held in Maya Bazaar and Anandapuram as part of National Menstrual Hygiene Day, with important messages conveyed through activities, games, and picture presentations. The Chennai team was involved in infrastructure related field visits and need based assessments throughout this month. The entire C-WASH team is excited for the upcoming month

STORIES OF CHANGE - MAYA BAZAAR

For the past ten years, large black spots in Mayabazaar have been a leading cause of a variety of health problems. The community members complained about the issue numerous times, but the Department never addressed their concerns or supported them. Jyoti, our field coordinator, wrote a complaint, collected 250 signatures from the community, and submitted it to the department in January. Following regular follow-up by SOCHARA, the officials visited the community in May and began the work of clearing the blockage. The community is pleased with our work, and a sense of responsibility has been ingrained in them that nothing is impossible if everyone works together to achieve it.

The inaugural ceremony of the newly constructed toilets at the Haragadde Government High School was held on May 18, 2022. The program was attended by the HCL Foundation team, school staff, a few students and the SOCHARA team. The programme was enhanced by a prayer song sung by a teaching staff, which filled the air with a sense of optimism before we lit the lamp. Following the lighting of the lamp, the dignitaries took the stage to share their valuable thoughts with the audience. Everyone was expressing their joy at the completion of this project and how the lack of toilets affected the students' health, education, and safety. There are high hopes that this step towards building new toilets would not only improve their health but also their academic performance. The staff testimonies filled the team with sheer delight for being able to encourage appropriate WASH behaviours through initiative.

BREAK THE SILENC BY SUGANDHA CHANDRA





After talking with the women in the communities and learning about their current knowledge, attitude, and practices regarding menstrual health and hygiene, we designed a two-hour intensive module to fill knowledge gaps and dispel myths about menstruation. To give the trainer and the ladies a break, the module was divided into two sessions.

On May 19th, we held MHHM awareness sessions for a group of 25 girls and women from the Maya Bazaar community. Despite the rain, the ladies attended both sessions and stayed. They were engaged and appeared to be eager to learn why they menstruate. They were kept entertained by the planned activities and games. The final section on product analysis was well-received by all participants.

On May 20th, we held the same sessions for a group of 26 Anandapuram community girls and women. Our field coordinators were invaluable in translating the content for the ladies and bridging any perceived gaps.

Going forward, the Field Coordinators will take on this task and hold additional sessions with various women in their communities until we achieve adequate coverage. This module was purposefully designed for women and girls because we realised it was their first such session and they were hesitant to talk about it. We intend to follow up with each group in the coming months, and we may plan a session for boys and men on the topic of menstruation if the community appears to be ready for it.

Nagar Police Boys and Girls club (newly included) scoutmaster for the initial field assessment on the possible WASH related activities in the upcoming quarters. Scout masters have also committed to support in the activities ahead.






GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF REGULAR **ACTIVITIES - MAY**
