

BACKGROUND

Community Health Cell grew out of a study: reflection-action-experimental project by a group of resource persons who moved beyond the Community Medicine Department of a medical college in Bangalore in 198;4.

The experimental phase of the, project was supported by the Centre for Non Formal and Continuing Education, Bangalore from 1984 till 1990.

In June 1990 the project was evaluated and the Society for Community Health Awareness, Research and Action was established as one of the follow up recommendations. The Community Health Cell became its functional unit.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To create an awareness in the principles and practice of Community Health among all people involved and interested in Health and related sectors.
- To undertake research in Community Health Policy issues particularly:
 - Community health care systems
 - Health human power training strategies
 - Health and development interactions
 - Medical pluralism and integration of medical systems.
- To evolve educational strategies that will enhance the knowledge, skill and attitudes of people involved in Community Health and development.
- To dialogue with health planners decision makers and administrators to enable the formulation and implementation of community oriented health policies.
- To promote and support community health action through voluntary as well as governmental initiative.

To build a library and documentation centre in community health to support our work.
